



KNOCKHILL GOING GREEN WITH SUSTAINABILITY PROJECTS

DID YOU KNOW?...

- ❑ In June 2024, Knockhill Racing Circuit formed a partnership with CATA CLEAN, one of the leading manufacturers of environmental automotive products for all our track and road cars.
- ❑ All electricity consumed is 100% UK generated renewable electricity and all waste is separated and recycled with waste tyres shredded and recycled.
- ❑ Knockhill has engaged with the Forestry Commission since 1983 with a tree planting programme which continued recently in 2021 and 2022 by former British Touring Car Championship driver Rory Butcher.
- ❑ All buildings are fuelled by LPG as are all the Kart Centre adult and junior karts.
- ❑ In 2023, Knockhill Motor Sports Club changed its Super Lap Scotland regulations to allow electric cars to compete.
- ❑ Knockhill was one of the first companies in Scotland to have a car charging point which is available to all visitors and 50% of the management team drive electric road cars.
- ❑ In 2022, the McRae Rally Challenge became one of the first events in the UK to 100% offset all competitor emissions with Carbon Positive Motorsport. In 2024, the Scottish Legends emissions has been 200% offset with all Knockhill Motor Sport Club championships to be offset by 2026.

COMING SOON

- ❑ Knockhill will achieve both FIA and Motorsport UK accreditation before the end of 2024 for their sustainability projects, measures and working practices.
- ❑ The use of sustainable fuels to be phased in over the next 5 years by working with Coryton Fuels, a world leader in sustainable fuels.
- ❑ Installation of solar panels to part generate our own power.
- ❑ An electric car to be added to the TeenDrive driving experience for 13 to 17-year-olds.
